REMEMBER- SAFETY FIRST:

- If you have been victimized and need to file a police report, please furnish your block captain with the name of the police officer who took your report and the case number so they may forward that information to their Neighborhood Watch Co-Captain.
- If you are going away, notify your Block Captain and immediate neighbors.
- Report anything suspicious to the Police. They prefer to spend 10 minutes checking out a call rather than 10 days following up on a crime that has already been committed.
- Never confront a suspect! This can be deadly! We are not policemen, we work in cooperation with the Police Department

BLOCK CAPTAIN DUTIES

- Attend orientation meetings and distribute basic Neighborhood Watch information to neighbors in assigned area (approximately 10).
- Collect completed Family Data Sheets once a year.
- Receive updates and distribute updates to assigned homes; report to Co-Chairperson any crime within area which resulted in the Police become involved.

CO-CHAIRPERSON DUTIES

- Attend orientation meetings with chairperson and block captains; distribute basic Neighborhood Watch information to Block Captains
- Collect completed Family Data Sheets from Block Captains
- Receive updates and distribute to Block Captains.
